

Medical Transportation Drivers

Our office is in need of volunteers who can help drive local residents to medical appointments within Manhattan. The requests for rides are rapidly growing and your help to keep this program running smoothly is greatly appreciated! This is a flexible opportunity depending on your schedule, but you must have a safe driving record, insurance, and a reliable vehicle.

Friendship Meals

Volunteers who can commit to a regular route or who can serve as substitute drivers are needed. Driver volunteers should be available to run their route(s) from 10:30am-12pm.

Ascension Via Christi Hospital

Volunteers who are interested in helping patients and their families are needed! At this time, volunteers may be required to have a current flu shot and COVID19 vaccinations.

*Mask requirements are dependent on the COVID19 case level in both Riley and Pottawatomie counties and are subject to change.

Ongoing Opportunities:

<u>Flint Hills Breadbasket</u>: Volunteers are needed Monday - Friday in a variety of shifts and positions. Help is especially needed in the Market every morning from 9-11:30am, but afternoon and behind-the-scenes opportunities are also available.

Be Able: The Shower/ Laundry facility is now open and volunteers are needed Monday through Friday 10am-12pm to help maintain the building. Volunteers will do light cleaning of showers after use, help neighbors run washing/ dryer machines and assist neighbors with clothing distribution as needed.

<u>Purple PAWS</u>: Volunteers are need for a variety of roles at their headquarters (Kitten Creek Rd; Keats), including helping with handyman repairs (winterize facility, install solar lights, repairing doors, and assembling kennels), walking the dogs, and organizing donated supplies. An orientation/training is provided as needed. Volunteers can help Monday-Friday during the day or weekend afternoons.

Cookie Brigade:

March 14th April 11th

We have shifted to once a month on the second Thursday! Cookies will go directly to units at Fort Riley or to local community service agencies. Cookies should be freshly baked within 24 hours of delivery to our office at 322 Houston Street, Suite 104 (Thursday by 1pm or the Wednesday before). Volunteers will package the cookies at the office before delivery.
